Institute News

First Senate Meeting

The Senate is a statutory body responsible for all academic matters of the Institute including monitoring, modifications and improvements. The Senate of the Institute was constituted on April 5, 2010 and the external members nominated to the first Senate are from IIT Bombay, Physical Research Laboratory Ahmedabad, and the Pandit Deendayal Petroleum University Gandhinagar. In his opening remarks at the first Senate meeting held on April 24, 2010, Professor Sudhir Jain, Senate Chairman, highlighted the critical role the Senate has to play in shaping the academics of the Institute and in guiding it to achieve a global reputation of excellence in education and research. In this meeting, the Senate considered several important issues such as strengthening of the PhD programme, starting a vibrant MTech programme, defining Minors courses, Excellence-in-Research Fellowships for young faculty, etc.



Prior to its constitution, , the functions of Senate were performed by an Academic Council consisting of Heads of the concerned Departments at IIT Bombay, this being the mentor institute. The Academic Council held five meetings between July 2008 and November 2009, and steered academics of the Institute very effectively.


The BWC held its first meeting on May 25, 2010. Mr. Rajiv Garg, Superintending Engineer, IIT Kanpur, Prof D P Roy, Professor Incharge, Engineering Disciplines and Major Gen (Retd.) Vijay Aga, OSD, also attended the meeting as special invitees. Two issues of immediate importance were considered: space requirements in the temporary campus at Chandkheda and the required course of action, and the process of selection of master planner/ architects for the permanent campus of the Institute.


IITGN makes history in Branch changes

IIT Gandhinagar is very liberal in granting change of branch to students based on academic performance after completion of their first year studies. It is highlighted by the fact that this year all the students who requested a change in branch before starting their second year studies were not only granted change of branch but all of them got the branch of their first preference. Thus, IITGN set a record in branch change policy – probably the first in the history of the IIT system.

Academic Performance of Students

At the end of the academic year 2009-10, a total of 16 second year students out of 90 secured a Cumulative Performance Index (CPI) of 9.0 and above, with Swetava Ganguli scoring highest CPI of 9.96. Twelve first year students, out of 109, secured a CPI of 9.0 and above, with Vipul Goyal securing highest CPI of 9.67.

Reaching Out

Professor Sudhir Jain participated in two meetings at the World Bank in Washington DC (USA) during June 1-4, 2010 (a) Understanding Risk Conference on Innovation in Disaster Risk, organized by the Global Facility for Disaster Risk Reduction (GFDRR) of the World Bank, and (b) Outreach Meeting of the Global Earthquake Model (GEM). During this visit, Dr. Jain visited the University of Maryland and met the graduate students and faculty there. He also met with the Pan IIT Leadership of the Washington DC area to brief them on the developments at the Institute. These meetings were facilitated by Prof Nitish Thakor of the Johns Hopkins University who is a friend of the Institute. Dr Jain also met the three IITGN undergraduate students (Neel, Anusha and Nishant) working in Professor Thakor's laboratories as the summer intern. He met with prominent IIT Kanpur alumni in the New Jersey area at a dinner organized by Dr Ram Misra, President of IIT Kanpur Foundation. Professor Jain spent a few days at the Ecole Polytechnique Federale De Lausanne (EPFL) Switzerland, where he discussed potential collaborations between EPFL and IITGN. He addressed the Indian graduate students and post doctoral fellows to encourage them to consider applying for faculty positions at IITGN. Professor Jain also held meetings in Paris with Ecole Centrale Paris and Telcom Sud-Paris for future collaborations.

Student Activities

IITGN Students Obtain Summer Internships

IITGN actively helps its students to obtain summer internships in industry, research organizations and academic institutes within India and abroad to help them gain exposure to different environments. Fourteen second year and four first year students obtained internship at research labs at five International Organizations including Johns Hopkins University, Washington University, and Underwriters Laboratory in USA, ENSAM France, and Nanyang Technological University Singapore. Twenty four students are doing their internship at different Indian Institutes including IITs, IPR and PRL. Thirty two students are doing their internship at industrial organizations including Tata Motors, Fluidyn Bangalore, and TCS.

IITGN Faculty Offers Summer Internships

IITGN faculty provided summer internships of 2 to 8 weeks duration to 10 of its own students and 8 students from other educational institutes including PDPU, NIT Surat, CEPT University, NIT Suratkal and JNCASR. Majority of the interns had completed their second or third year of studies, while one intern was a post graduate student. The interns were guided at IITGN by Dr S K Jain, Dr V Narayanan, Dr D Modi and Dr S Dalvi.

Adventure Trip

A group of 30 students under the leadership of the Student Counselor Jasbir Kaur Thadhani went on an excursion from May 5 to May 20, 2010.
